





Wickenburg Antiques & Artisans Is Celebrating Its 2nd Anniversary

If you are looking for a fun shopping activity, you could head to Wickenburg to enjoy some western hospitality and help **Wickenburg Antiques & Artisans** celebrate its 2nd

Anniversary on September 1!

Located in a restored hotel that was built in the late 1880s, this mall is home to more than 18 dealers and 50 consignors.



Visitors will find lots of offerings to check out, including: antiques, collectibles, cowboy, Indian, vintage, jewelry, home décor, furniture, clothing, gifts, art along with homemade cookies, candy and jelly.

Owner Beth Gallant opened the mall with Laura Bovee-Lemon on September 1, 2010, and the business has grown to fill two stories with over 3500 feet of space. The two women began working together when Beth rented space in an antique store that Laura owned for eight years in their current building until 2005 when it was closed, renovated and turned into a real

Enjoy Hassayampa River Preserve, Then Explore Wickenburg Antique Shops

The Hassayampa River Preserve outside of Wickenburg is a true desert oasis complete with palm trees, a pond that is home to frogs and waterfowl and a mysterious river that rises from the depths of the desert sand. Hassayampa is an Apache word, which is roughly translated as "river which runs upside down."

For most of the 100-mile course through the desert, the Hassayampa River flows underground. But within the Preserve its crystal clear waters emerge, flowing above ground throughout the year. The lush streamside habitat of the Hassayampa is home to some of the desert's most spectacular wildlife.

Visitors can expect to find year round events and programs that allow them to experience the desert in its natural habitat. The Preserve offers material for self-guided tours or nature walks, along with classes and guided tours. Birding, photography, exploring both day and night, Monarch Migration, Nature Mosaics, Rain Water Harvesting and Cooking with Desert Plants are just a few of the events and classes that will be offered





In 2010, Beth and Laura were able to lease the historic hotel themselves and have worked side-by-side for the past two years. Now, Laura is retiring from their partnership, but will still have



a booth in the mall. Beth says, "Laura is a wonderful person and a good friend. She taught me many things about antiques and the business of selling them."

Beth's husband Vic helps with the business in any way she needs him, and Hailey Bovee also works at the store.

Part of the appeal of Wickenburg Antiques & Artisans is its unique historic building. Since the original owners were from Texas, it was called The Texas Hotel when

Wickenburg was a stage stop. Over the years, it has been used for many purposes, and at one time was the Texas Cafe and Bar.

Beth remembers, "When I was in high school (in the late 1960s), we came to the Texas Cafe to eat lunch. They were still renting the seven little rooms upstairs to truck drivers who drove at night. In 2005, the building was entirely remodeled into a

beautiful reproduction of a vintage hotel. The rooms are still upstairs and are rented to dealers."

Beth grew up in Wickenburg from the age of 6, graduated from WHS and got a degree in Journalism from NAU. She worked in Phoenix until moving back to the town she loves over 15 years ago with her husband and daughter.

In the future, Beth hopes to use the parking lot once a month for an Open Air Market



where Vendors could rent space to sell their items. These could include art, crafts, antiques and farmers' market items.

Wickenburg Antiques & Artisans is located at 278 E. Wickenburg Way and is open seven days a week from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Rental spaces are available from a small space to a whole room, and Consignors are welcome. 

We collect the things we love. Sometimes love lasts and sometimes it fades, even with our collectibles!

I have three dish sets. One is my everyday set (Johnson Bros. Olde English Countryside), one is for holidays and special celebrations (Johnson Bros. Friendly Village), and the third is my "when I feel like something different" set (Mix-matched, Blue Willow). If I should ever downsize or move, I'd sell the Blue Willow because it seldom gets used more than for Sunday breakfast.

But we have to be emotionally ready to let go—and, sometimes, financially ready. What I mean is—if you have a set that you put together 'piece by piece,' it adds up to be an expensive set, and you seldom get back your investment. Yes, our treasures are an investment. Some we get back what we paid; others we make a profit. Then there are the times you have to 'bite the bullet' and take a loss.







Rinker On Collectibles

The Call To Buy

by Harry Rinker

Linda and I recently visited the Allegan (MI) Flea Market. It is a throwback to the great flea markets of the 1980s and 1990s—a strong gate, a wide variety of merchandise ranging from antiques and collectibles for the traditional collectors to pizzazz and functional decorating pieces, a strong emphasis on the Country Look, and affordable merchandise. Most attendees left with one or more purchases. As I watched dealers record mid-afternoon sales, I noticed many using a second and third page. Several years ago, dealers considered themselves lucky to fill half a page. My general impression is that, at least in respect to Allegan, things are looking up.

Linda had specific shopping goals in mind—find an older plant stand for use on our front or back porch, add some additional pieces to her grandmother's Blue Willow pattern dinnerware service, which she recently rescued from the to-be-sold pile at The School in Vera Cruz (PA), and a fun conversation piece for the table entering her Davenport University office. Linda met all three of her goals as well as adding two pieces of jewelry to her collection.

The call to buy always has fascinated me. What prompts a person to buy an antique, collectible or desirable? Functional need is too easy an explanation. While I am among those who tout the antiques and collectibles marketplace as a great source for cheaper-than-new buying, I do not see it as one of the prime buying motivators. The antiques and collectibles market does have things people need if they do not already own one, for example, a bed in which to sleep or a chair in which to sit. But, those with functional needs do not think of an antiques and collectibles sale venue as the first place to turn to fill these needs. The call to buy antiques and collectibles extends far beyond functional need.

When asked what prompts me to buy, I often tell the asker that I listen to the mystical voices in my head. As I walk through the aisles at an antiques and collectibles flea market, mall, shop or show, I hear voices calling to me. "Look over here," "Take me home with you," "I have been waiting for you," "You need me," and "Buy me" are a few examples. Having talked with thousands of individuals involved with the trade, I know that Continued on page 19...

I am not alone. Such voices exist. Years ago, the voices were much stronger. Now, I am hearing impaired. Even when I am wearing my hearing aids, the voices are softer or silent.

I ceased trying to figure out why I suddenly stop and my eyes focus on a single object in a booth or case. Is it fate, coincidence, skill or something different? My eyes scanned hundreds, even thousands of objects prior to my stopping. Why did I pass all the others and focus on this one particular object? What called me to this particular object?

It is difficult, if not impossible, to pinpoint the origin of the call to buy. It is internal and personal. It begins as a hidden desire or want, in place long before the buy occurs. There are multiple explanations—a cherished memory, an urge or necessity to collect, a functional need, a coveting, or simply a will to possess.

Deciding to explore antiques and collectibles sales venue is the first step in awakening the call to buy. In the past, this meant attending an antiques and collectibles auction, reading the advertisements in a trade periodical, exploring a mail auction *Continued on page 20...*

catalog, or visiting a flea market, mall, shop, or show. Today, it involves turning on a computer and checking Internet auction, direct sale, and storefront websites. In the 21st century, buying antiques and collectibles is a 24/7 experience.

The call to buy is primarily unconscious. Something, usually an object, triggers it. A friend's "Isn't this what you have been looking for?" comment works. Once the call to buy is triggered, the buyer's senses become acute. His/her eyes water. A heightened sense of awareness, a mental alertness, results from an adrenalin rush. The desire to reach out and touch, even to hold the object, is overwhelming.

The desire to buy and the call to buy are not the same. Linda left for Allegan with the desire to buy. She set specific goals. While she hoped to fulfill her goals, she was prepared to be disappointed. While at Allegan, she saw over a dozen different plant stands. Only one evoked the call to buy.

There also is a difference between the call to buy and completing the transaction. A potential buy begins when the call is heard. The successful completion of the sale involves a number of hurdles, any one of which can quickly prove insurmountable.

In an ideal world, a buyer has an unlimited supply of cash, thus allowing him/her to answer every call to buy. In reality, today's buyers are sophisticated and more cautious about parting with their hard earned dollars.

I buy based upon my "God means me to own it" theory: If God means me to own an object, I will find it in the condition I desire, at a price I am willing to pay, and with money in my pocket to pay for it. This three-part equation has failed at all points. It is especially painful when the first two criteria are met and the last is not.

Resistance to the call to buy takes the form of questions. What do I need this for? Can I do better if I continue the hunt? Does not this price seem high? How am I going to get it home? Where am I going to put it if I do get it home? What is my spouse/partner going to say? Questions such as these and more can derail the buying process.

The call to buy can be encouraged, something antiques and collectibles dealers are loath to do. Dealers are far to wedded to the "if I display it, they will come" concept. Many Allegan Flea Market dealers still adhered to the unorganized pile and stuff the booth merchandising techniques of the past. I walked passed dozens of uninviting booths because they were so cluttered and/ or had no order to the merchandise displayed within them. If there was an object that would have triggered my call to buy, it went unseen.


A price tag is an offer, essential to triggering my call to buy. I do not buy from dealers who do not price their objects. While attending the Allegan Flea Market, I picked up an object in a booth where objects were not priced. Without even inquiring about my interest, the dealers said, "I can do fifty." I did not respond. Sensing my hesitation and again without any conversational exchange, he countered, "Make that thirty-five." I shook my head no. "I can do twenty-five." I put the object down and walked away.

In another booth, I picked up a Blue Willow small oval serving dish with a price tag of \$95.00. Before I could show it to Linda, the dealer sitting in a chair at the opposite end of his booth called over "everything is half price." Even at half price, the object was overpriced.

The call to buy is an invitation to the seller to strike up a conversation, tout the merchandise and close the sale. Alas, most sellers think the call to buy is all that is needed to complete the sale. "The buyer looked really interested, but he walked away," is a common lament.

While the call to buy is inherent in everyone, it diminishes with age. Ten years ago, I felt differently. I turned 70 in 2011. Over the past several years, the number of objects I purchased when attending antiques and collectibles flea markets, malls, shops, and shows has diminished yearly. In 2001, I bought an object a day on eBay. I did not buy one object on eBay in 2011.

Thank God for Linda. First, the call to buy still is strong within her. Our home would be filled with a great many more









### Vogue Picture Records Back in Vogue Again!

As lovers of antiques, we are avid collectors. It's especially rewarding to collect something unique that makes others cylinders that dominated for nearly two decades. That is until envious. This column features a fascinating piece of history that Emil Berliner introduced the 78 RPM disc record in the early

few know about. But let's start at the beginning.

Over the last sixty-five years recording technology has changed many times - 78 rpm, the 33 1/3 LP, 45s, 8 track, cassette, CD, MP3, and DVD.

Now, many own no physical recordings. They have an ethereal musical library that only resides on a device. Which leads us to wonder what will be around to collect in the future?

Because technology is evolving so rapidly, it's difficult to keep track of changes - and even harder to keep upto-date with equipment. But that was not always the case.

The era of recorded sound began in 1877 when Thomas Edison first recited Mary Had A little Lamb into

a metal horn that amplified his voice that was then etched into creation of plastics manufacturer Tom Saffady. a tin foil-wrapped cylinder. What started as a simple dictation multi-billion dollar music industry of today.



The first Vogue Picture Record issued in May 1946 featured the Clyde McCoy Orchestra playing Elgin Street Blues and Sugar Blues. Jay Mark

Initially, Edison captured sound on wax, and later, celluloid

1890s. The two forms competed until about WW1 when it was apparent that the 78 was spelling the end to Edison's more fragile cylinder.

Over the years, the standard 10" 78 was a familiar part of nearly every American home. The technology gradually improved from acoustic to electronic recording and reproduction. All the while, the recording medium became stronger and more durable. The end of its eight-decade reign of the 78 became evident in 1948 with the introduction of the vinyl Long-Play record and, a year later, with the 45—that's the one with the large center hole.

One of the most innovative series of 78s from the end of the era, and highly prized by collectors, is the Vogue Picture Record. It was the



Vogue Picture Records, continued from previous page... records featured a colorfully illustrated paper sheet laminated on an aluminum center and encapsulated in clear vinyl.

The imaginative images with a characteristically '40s feel reflected the theme of the songs—one for each side.

The first release featured Clyde McCoy, a popular jazz trumpeter whose signature song was Sugar Blues. A descendant of the Hatfield family of the infamous Hatfield-McCoy Feud, Clyde McCoy recreated his song for Vogue's debut fifteen years after he first recorded it.

Musical repertory ranged from jazz and Big Band to country. Shep Fields recorded for Sav-Way as did The Hour of Charm All-Girl Orchestra.

Selling for about \$1, the first novel Picture Record was released in May 1946. But the ambitious, complex experiment was short-lived. Competing major labels were selling their recordings for considerably less—for about fifty cents. The price differential combined with a very limited catalogue of popular artists doomed the fledgling label.

Fifteen months and about 75 recordings later, Sav-Way Industries was bankrupt and out of business. The master recordings and remaining inventory were liquidated or destroyed, leaving a limited market for today's collectors.

In a 1990 book review, Tim Brooks offered his observation on the popularity of Vogue Records: "The interest is probably due more to Vogue's gaudy, campy illustrations, which are prototypically 'forties.' Even contemporary reviewers called them 'glamour-puss disks' and, less kindly, 'coal company calendar art."

For the most part, Picture Records still remain affordable. Average prices run between \$30 - \$75. Very rare numbers can reach into the thousands of dollars.

Junk in the Trunk Vintage Markets was born from the idea that the greater Phoenix area needed a bit more junk in their trunks. ### Turquoise & Turquoise Jewelry Are Linked to Great Southwest

by Dwight Schannep

Turquoise and turquoise jewelry has always been linked with the Great Southwest. Southwest Indian jewelry is very distinctive in style and is widely recognized as having come from this region of the world.

Around 1880, turquoise started to appear in Arizona's Native American Indian silver jewelry. From about 1910 to 1940, the popularity of this turquoise jewelry exploded through the efforts of one man-Fred Harvey, who was the principal food vendor for the transcontinental Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad Company in the last half of the 19th century.

Harvey installed souvenir counters along the train routes and encouraged and organized Native American Indians to sell their jewelry, blankets and baskets. Authentic Fred Harvey jewelry is characterized by stamped arrows and bows, thunderbirds, snakes, whirling logs and often contains symmetrically cut small oval pieces of turquoise and is signed.

During this time period, other pieces, such as those produced by H.H. Tammen with similar characteristics, were often called "Fred Harvey Style." Jewelry in the "Fred Harvey style" is the

Indian jewelry that comes to mind when reminiscing about the souvenir jewelry sold tourist stops along Arizona's Route 66 and at the Grand Objects Canyon. with these trader-

influenced motifs were lighter weight and less expensive than earlier traditional Indian jewelry, hence this jewelry was of great interest for tourists traveling in the Southwest.

Arizona is a large producer of copper and turquoise is strongly associated with copper. Turquoise is almost always found in the upper portions of copper deposits, usually no deeper than 100 to 150 feet. A few of Arizona's more popular mines include Morenci, Kingman, and Sleeping Beauty from Globe.

Turquoise is a very complex mineral that occurs in many Continued on page 41...

Turquoise, continued from page 34... different types of rocks. It may have a wide range of chemical compositions, which are manifested through its extreme variations in color and patterns. Identifying the mine that produced a specific piece of turquoise can be extremely difficult because a single mine can produce a large variety of colors, matrix and density of stones.

Turquoise is formed when surface waters percolate slowly downward through igneous rocks containing

phosphorous, aluminum, copper and iron. As long as copper, aluminum, and phosphorous and water are present in substantial quantities, turquoise can be concentrated—no matter the rock type. These elements dissolve and concentrate in cavities in the rocks, combining to form the mineral, turquoise. As there are so many geologic factors involved in the creation of turquoise, turquoise deposits are small and erratic. *Continued on page 44...*





An arid or desert-type climate is ideal for turquoise, as too much water prohibits the chemical reactions necessary for the formation of turquoise. It gets its color from the heavy metals in

the ground from where it forms.

Blue turquoise forms when there is copper present, which is the case with most Arizona turauoise.

Green turquoise forms where iron is present, which is the case with most Nevada black matrix.

Sleeping Beauty Turquoise:

Turquoise varies in quality from Gem quality to low grade "chalk." Gem quality turquoise is hard while low-grade turquoise is soft and must be treated to make it usable in jewelry.

The following treatments are applied to "chalk" or "low grade" turquoise:

Reconstituted turquoise created by pulverized turquoise, which is turned into a powder and mixed with epoxy. Dyed turquoise is created with pigment added to deepen a stone's color.

Stabilized turquoise is created when a low grade, chalky or unstable turquoise is treated with a






