Mall owners are Michelle Tully and Steve Perez. When asked what one phrase best describes their business, Steve said, "The joy of variety."





Annual Prescott Antique Show & Vintage Market on July 23rd & 24th

The Prescott Antique Show & Vintage Market will be held at the Findlay Toyota Center in Prescott Valley on July 23rd and 24th. Organizers are delighted to report that interest in the upcoming Event is nothing short of fantastic!

There will be a huge variety of quality antiques in every category plus authentic vintage items with wide appeal—including popular repurposed, rustic barn, 50s & 60s, and so much more. Enjoy the cool temperatures of the Prescott area while you shop the "Antique Capitol of Arizona."

The beautiful Findlay Toyota Center, 3201 N. Main St., is a spacious event center featuring an arena area with surrounding seating for more than 5000 plus a concourse area with food concessions. Close to 80% of available Show spaces are now sold. As with many established businesses in Las Vegas, **Charleston Antique Mall** has a long and interesting history. It started in1987 on Western Ave. as The Red Rooster in a building reminiscent of an old barn and was filled with antique and collectible goodies. It expanded in 1992 and, in 2006, the name was changed to **Charleston Antique Mall** to reflect a new

Charleston Blvd. location.



In March 2008, dealers Michelle and her husband Cal Tully bought the business and, with their love of and passion for antiques and vintage collectibles, **Charleston Antique Mall** started to become a must-stop location that was again expanding to accommodate new dealers. 





Those Were the Days!

What Once Was

by Jay Mark

Nearly a half-century has passed since I transitioned from antiques collector to dealer. And what a ride it has been.

My journey began in the 1960s and early 1970s, a period that introduced a dramatic change to the world of antiques. Prior to that time, antiques were mostly the domain of the wealthy—collectors of pre-Industrial artifacts. Elitists looked down their noses at anything later, relegating them to the demeaning classification of second-hand. "Hoity-toity," might be an apt description.

Carl W. Drepperd, a respected, prolific writer of more than a dozen books about antiques in the 1940s and 1950s was

one of them. In the forward to his Victorian: book The Cinderella of Antiques, published in 1950, Drepperd admitted to writing about decade a before "a scathing article about Victorian antiques." represented Thev

a period in which Victorian-era pieces were relegated to the junk bin. Admonished by a colleague saying, "You cannot be that abusive and vitriolic on a subject unless you are woefully lacking in data about it," set Drepperd on a path of reevaluation.

His five-year course of research brought Drepperd to a difficult admission, "Instead of a prejudiced opponent of the style we have been calling Victorian, I have become a placid proponent of the style..." This proved a prescient statement of what was about to come.

By the 1960s, pieces of not-great age were gaining attention. And value. They were outstanding examples of extraordinary beauty and craftsmanship. Think of the works of Louis Comfort Tiffany or Gustav Stickley.

This new appreciation for more modern artifacts led to a revised understanding and definition of "antique." While it made no sense, 100 years became an arbitrary, accepted benchmark.

This was a heady period—often of intriguing revelations. It was a time when otherwise forgotten things were introduced into a new consciousness—leading to a desire for collecting. Publications like the Antique Trader, which anticipated the emerging trend, started in 1957, came along to help educate, interpret and provide a pre-Internet forum for buying and selling in the burgeoning market.

The prestigious *Maine Antique Digest*, which balanced the "classical" definition of "antique" with the new era of collecting, began publishing in 1973. And continues today.

It seemed that avid collecting would never abate. With that in mind, I told my customers that nothing appreciated or retained its value more than antiques—an adage that remained so for more than three decades.

I could see no end to what customers were craving. But time has proved me wrong. In the past half-century, we have seen the emergence of new generations to which we give distinctive names. Many of us are the *Silent Generation (pre-1945) or Baby Boomers* (1946-1964). Now, we have *Gen-X's* (1965-1976), followed by *Millennials or Gen-Y's* (1977-1995), and *Gen-Z's* (1996) – 2010s), each carrying their own unique traits and personalities.

For some time now, the antiques' market has been adjusting to appeal to these new generations. Although the overall desire to collect has waned, interest in antiques still remains high. Today, most antiques are purchased on impulse rather than in a programmatic manner.





Collector's Corner

Premiums & Who Pays Them?

by Jim Olson

The Romans were said to have charged the first buyer's premium at auctions, thus dating the charge back to around the time of the birth of Jesus Christ. However, the modern day buyer's premium was re-introduced during the mid-1970s by Christie's and Sotheby's auctions. The introductory rate they charged was 10%. Often called by the slang term "juice," buyer's premiums have been around ever since—and are very common now.

What is a buyer's premium (BP), some may ask?

A buyer's premium is a charge or fee (usually a percentage) in addition to the hammer price of an item at an auction. The winning bidder is required to pay both the hammer price (winning bid announced) and a percentage of that price, AKA—buyer's premium. This percentage may range from 1% to 10% in real estate auctions and from 10% to 30% in art and collectibles auctions. Equipment and car type auctions usually fall somewhere in the middle of those ranges. It is estimated today that over 80% of auctioneers charge a buyer's premium. How exactly is a buyer's premium calculated?

Let's say a piece of art sold for \$5,000 and there was a 10% premium at this particular auction. The price paid by the buyer would be \$5,500 (\$5,000 hammer price plus 10% BP). Taxes and any other applicable fees such as shipping and handling may be added on top of that. But why even charge a buyer's premium at all?

Auction houses charge a BP for several reasons, but the bottom line is to stay in business and hopefully remain profitable.

Everything continues to age, meaning new categories of "antiques" will always emerge. But, in these digital times, what will future antiques look like? People no longer write long letters. There is not much to collect in emails. Material recordings—cylinder records, 78 rpms, 45s and LPs—have given way to ethereal digital. What will there be to collect in another 50 or 100 years?

History is cyclical. And I am an optimist. What is passé today will become popular again. Just when is the question.





(As a side note, the main segment of the auction industry, making up most of the small percentage of auctions that do not charge a BP, is the livestock auction industry. Consequently, many smaller livestock auction business have gone under in the last couple of decades because margins were too small to remain in business.) So a buyer's premium is basically a fee to help cover the escalating costs involved with running an auction business. There are many costs that go into the events that most people do not consider. And a whole new category of costs have evolved during the last few decades with the now, near-necessity, of having auctions offered online. For those who advocate against a BP, maybe try to think of it as a necessary evil in order for the auction to keep bringing you items to bid on.

"But don't auctions collect a commission from the seller?" some ask.

Most of the time an auctioneer does collect a commission from both the seller and from the buyer. However, as competition for quality items has become greater, commissions charged to sellers went down over time. Before buyer's premiums were charged, sellers usually paid higher commissions than they do now, even though it is now more expensive than ever to put on auctions. In some extreme cases, if a seller has a particularly rare or valuable item that several auction houses wish to represent, they may actually pay no commission at all and the only way for an auctioneer to cover expenses is through the buyer's premium. The norm now-a-days, however, is for the auctioneer to collect a little something from each side (seller and buyer) as their profits from the seller's side has diminished.

In the auction business, there are expenses associated with both the buying side and selling side of the transaction—and expenses associated with the buying side have skyrocketed. As mentioned, a prime example of expenses that did not used to be factors 40 years ago are fees charged by online providers who make it possible for an auctioneer to present items to buyers at their convenience, no matter where they are.

Think about this for a minute: Everyone who shops, no matter where they shop, pays a "buyer's premium" whether they realize it or not. It may not be called such outside of the auction world, but I submit to you that every purchase has it built in. In a retail setting it's called a markup, while in auctions, it's called commissions or premiums—but everyone pays it no matter where they shop.

You see, in a retail setting, the sellers set a price. They factor in expenses and profit margin (and usually a little room for discounts or sales) and then set a price deemed appropriate and that the market will bare. Every retail outlet, from a big box store to a local Mom and Pop, has the overhead and profit margin built into the price a customer pays. Customers just don't notice all the little fees added in because they are lumped into one number without being broken down.

At an auction, however, the buyers set the price. The price paid for an item will not go any higher than what two or more bidders are willing to bid up to. And the auctioneers' jobs are to bring those sellers and buyers together. While facilitating these true market discovery transactions, they are typically paid on a commission basis. But just like a retail outlet, there are expenses and profit margins that have to be covered (if they want to remain in business anyway). What auction customers should remember (and factor in) is that even if you add up the fees, etc., the overall purchase price paid at auction is often less, or at least not more than, what one might expect to pay in a retail setting. And there's always the chance it could be much lower!



Ignite Sign Museum in Tucson Offers Neon Fun, Classes & Events

When I head out to deliver *Antique Register* newspapers, there are times when I don't know what I'll discover or how much fun I'll have. And a recent Saturday trip to Tucson was one of those times. An article we'd done about the **Ignite Sign Museum** had intrigued me and I wanted to see in person the colorful collection of neon signs that I had read about. Wow—what a fabulous place to explore—it was beyond my expectations!

Co-owner Monica Hay Cook was there to take me on a tour. Her husband, sign maker Jude Cook, has a passion for saving signs of the past and that led to their opening **Ignite** in 2018. Over the years, Jude has not only created and restored signs, he has amassed an extensive collection that needed to be housed, which led to the museum that they now share with visitors.

On this Saturday, Jude was teaching a class in the bone yard so we headed outside to





see what was happening. Jude has spent his lengthy career in the design and sign industry. He began his own sign business over 40 years ago and, through his Cook & Company Signmakers, started restoring historic signs about nine years ago. He has rescued many of Arizona's landmark historic signs—some at the eleventh hour just as they were scheduled for demolition and, without Jude, would have been lost.

I was fascinated watching the Grant Stone Restoration Class participants scraping and sanding in order to uncover the sign's original colors. Activities include sign archaeology, research, resources and trends, neon and hand lettering removal and restoration demonstrations, metal repair and painting, and load

Savvy bidders know about the fees and factor them in. It is recommended to have your maximum bid amount in mind before bidding. That way, you can calculate the buyer's premium, taxes, shipping, handling and any other applicable fees beforehand and know the amount you feel comfortable bidding up to.

To sum it up, everyone pays a markup/premium/juice or whatever you want to call it when you purchase items. That is the only way businesses selling the items can remain open. While some complain about the fees, the truth is that the market sets them. In an open, capitalistic marketplace, folks who charge too much do not remain in business long. If an auction company (or any other business) charges their sellers too much (or doesn't pay their suppliers enough), before long they have nothing good to sell because sellers go elsewhere where they are treated better. The same logic applies to the buyer's premium. If it is too high for the item(s) being offered, buyers will not patronize that auction (business) for long and will go elsewhere. Conversely, if a business does not charge enough, they will not be open long.



The 7,000 sq. ft sign bone yard is a clean, open area for the restoration work and finished projects are also displayed. Each sign has a history and may be remembered from its original

location along Tucson streets and

neighborhoods.



Other classes offered include a Neon Project where you learn the skills necessary to assemble and light up your own neon sculpture. Under the step-by-step guidance of an experienced teacher and artist, you can complete a project from salvaged neon pieces. Participants choose a neon piece and backer and will walk through the process of lighting it up and turning it into a neon wall or countertop sculpture. They will leave with their own neon project to display at home or work.

The Signs and Sips class is a relaxing one where you can discover your inner artist and paint your own Tucson Gateway Cactus. You will receive step-by-step directions with no experience needed. All the materials you need are provided canvases, brushes and paint—so bring a friend or come solo.


