





### Those Were The Days!

### Psst! We Dish Out the Inside "Scoop"

O.K. Today we're really going to *dish* it out as I give you the inside *scoop* about special tools designed to serve what is arguably America's favorite dessert. You'll discover that getting ice cream out of its container can be almost as much fun as eating it.

But first. ice goes cream back to the dawn of civilization. Some say it was the Chinese who figured out how freeze things to and subsequently created what might be considered ice cream. But then there is evidence the ancient Egyptians

were making an ice cream-like concoction long before the Chinese. Much later, it is said, Italy discovered the delicious dessert.

And, of course, when nearby France got hold of it, they made it their own.

Closer to home, in the U.S., ice cream goes back to Revolutionary America. We know Dolly Madison dished out the frozen delight in the White House. With the introduction of the home-use, hand crank ice cream freezer in 1846, anyone could turn out a decent pint or two.

It was natural for drug store soda fountains that came along in the 1850s to add ice cream to their menu. With so many people clamoring for this delightful treat, a new challenge arose—how to easily and efficiently get ice cream from a container to a dish. Initially, spoons were used. But they proved to be inefficient and hard work.

The first patent for a mechanical ice cream scoop was awarded in 1878 to William Clewel of Reading, Pennsylvania. This may be the time to note that the early serving devices were called by a number of names. In his patent application, for example, Clewel described his invention as an "Ice Cream Measure and Mould." Later, other inventors labeled their mechanical appliances as "disher," "dipper," "scoop," and "spoon" for non-mechanical servers.

Believe it or not "scoop" is a relatively modern name for the more traditional term "disher."

Clewel's pioneering concept for a device that could dish a measured and shaped amount of ice cream would ultimately lead to nearly 250 patents being issued before WW II. That's a good enough number to form a collection.

Most 19th century scoops were two-handed affairs—conical shaped with an inside blade that was rotated from the top to scrape the frozen treat from the walls of the bowl, leaving an appealing cone shaped serving. Sensing there was a more efficient way of serving ice cream than with a spoon, African-American hotel porter, Alfred L. Cralle, was one of the first to introduce the one-hand concept with his 1896 patent application. By the 1890s, more complex mechanisms that allowed for one-handed operation were being awarded patents.

The 1890s also saw the introduction of the recognizable bowl-shaped scoops. And, by the 20th century, inventors were coming up with more imaginative ideas in the forms of complex mechanisms and odd shapes—pie à la mode, banana split, heart to be served in special heart-shaped dishes, cylindrical, bullet, tubular and more. But the most popular form was the ball—a perfect fit for filling the top of an ice cream cone that, by the way, was introduced at the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair.

An indication of the popularity and demand for ice cream dishers are the number of manufacturers that emerged to produce them. While many started up in the 1920s, between the 19th century and the present day, 56 companies have been documented as producers

of ice cream scoops. Raymond Gilchrist, one of the most recognized names in scoop manufacturing, began making dippers in about 1907. His company grew to be the largest maker of scoops. The Gilchrist #33 Pyramid Disher was patented in 1910 and was designed to serve ice cream in a fancy shape on a plate.


The novel, nickel-overbrass IcyPi disher was created by James Denaro, an Italian immigrant ice cream cone manufacturer, who in the mid-1920s began making a 3-sided wafer "box" to hold a square of ice cream, for his novel ice cream sandwich. Ultimately cream sandwich dispensers.

cream dippers are a relatively inexpensive collectible. Depending on rarity, mechanical ice cream scoops can range in value from about under \$10 to about \$100... depending on rarity. It's best if they are clean and mechanically sound, still serviceable and fun to use pieces of history.

Hint: In most scoops, you will find a number on the scraper blade. It indicates how many measured scoops will be dished from a quart of ice cream. Most are in the range of 6 to 40 scoops, which explains why ice cream servers are found in a variety of sizes.





Collector's Corner

### The Allure of 'Prison-Made'

by Jim Olson

Many are drawn to collect items made by prisoners. Why is there such an allure with collecting these items? What makes them collectible? What are the stories behind those who made them?

Prison-made items have been on collectors' lists for a very long time. For example, starting way back in the 1890s, Frank Conley, the warden at Deer Lodge, Montana, created various programs in order to keep inmates busy. He believed it would keep them out of trouble. Deer Lodge Montana's horsehair braiding program was one of the best known and popular inmate programs of its kind and people collect bridles made at Deer Lodge (and many other prisons) to this day.

Canon City, Colorado, was another prison that had a bridle making program, except it was also one of the few prisons that had a metal shop. Consequently, it became known for making bits and spurs (along with horsehair bridles) and those bits and spurs are now some of the most prized items in many collectors' possession.

Over the years, various prisons became known for producing different items. But why collect them? One common reason heard is that folks are amazed at someone taking the time to build such an item by hand, using crude tools, and have it come out as good as it does. Since prisoners obviously have plenty of time on their hands, they tend to be very patient and take their time when making

these crafts. It's similar, perhaps, to what attracted us to Native American-made crafts in the beginning. An appreciation for the time it takes and the fact that their tools and conditions may not have been the best yet they were able to turn out a quality product, usually of much better quality than a mass produced piece of similar use.

Other reasons given range from being charitable (supporting someone who may not be in the best of circumstances) to the allure of it being made by an individual who does not conform to normal societal standards yet has an artistic side. I once heard a guy say, while holding a pair of prison-made spurs, "Just imagine, the S.O.B. who made these spurs also killed someone." One thing is for certain, though, by buying the crafts, it helps to fund a portion of their rehabilitation.

So what makes them collectible? I suppose it's the same things that make anything collectible—desirability, rarity and condition. Somebody wants them; they are in limited supply; and they remain in good condition after all these years. That is what makes anything collectible when you get right down to it. But prison-made items seem to reach a whole other category of collectors. I know several people who collect nothing but prison-made bits or spurs, etc. Who knows why this is—the reasons are likely as varied as the collectors themselves.

Perhaps it is the intrigue about the men who made them. At some time or another, we have all probably known someone who spent time in prison. A lot of them may have even seemed like pretty good folks. Others who are incarcerated are just down right

Again, maybe it's the fact that this person, who obviously had enough troubles to be locked up, also has an artistic side and can create works of art without the aide of using the best tools or having the best situation. Even a great Native Warrior like Geronimo turned to making trinkets once he was locked up by the Government. People flocked to buy something he had made. I guess the contrast between being a fierce warrior and an artist was intriguing.

Besides the quality and intrigue, could it be the brand? I know guys who will not drive anything but a Ford, for no other reason than that is what their daddy drove as did their daddy's daddy, etc. There are folks out there who will just buy certain items because they are brands they are familiar with. Maybe when they were young they were told that a prison-made horsehair bridle is the best money can buy and they won't buy anything else to this day as a result of that thought taking hold in their minds. Other reasons might be monetary. Prison-made collectibles cover a wide range of prices that can fit most collectors' budgets.

But, as mentioned, the reasons vary greatly as to why we collect prison-made items. Perhaps you have your own reason. We would love to hear from you. Happy collecting!

## Downsizing Tips for Estate & Yard Sales

by Becky J. Dunlap

As the long time owner of an antiques' business as well as being a furniture restorer, I understand the challenge of "downsizing." No matter what the reason might be, it can be a daunting task! Over the years, I have set up some guidelines and helpful advice to make it easier to do estate, yard and similar sales.

**Date and Time** – Set your date and time, taking into consideration potential conflicts during the month and temperatures where the sale will be held. Note that people often arrive early including even the day before the sale.

Advertising – Use all the media you can, including both paid and free, such as local newspaper classified advertising, craigslist, the Internet and Facebook groups (if you are not members, ask someone who is to post for you.) Establish your coverage area. Some Internet ads, like craigslist, will put ads on mobile apps for people to find you and can include photos of sale items. Check area laws on posting signs on poles; you need permission from homeowners and businesses to put a sign on their property. Some people put signs in/on parked cars with the sale address and directions.

**Traffic Flow** – post signs where needed, create a good traffic flow where people can shop and get to items. Have additional people roaming sale to help (carry items to check out or to start a "pile") answer questions, load items in vehicles and watch exits.

**Set-up** – Use all your space. Make and use all flat surfaces. Putting like items together. Band smaller items together in zip lock type bags or with blue painter's tape.


**Boxes, Bags & Newspaper** – Have lots of small & medium boxes, plus grocery bags and newspaper for wrapping customer's items. This will help your customers shop for more items and make it easy to carry things home.

**Pricing** – Using a Dot System, assign values to colored dots for smaller priced items. Posting several listings of dots and values at Sale.


• ½ Price Sale – ½ off everything. Set the day and time. Mark items before sale not included in this sale.

- Bag Sale This should be listed in your ad. Give everything a plastic page (your choice of size-grocery, kitchen garbage) and tell them the price is a certain amount per bag – anything they can fit into the bag.
- Bid Box Name and phone number written on paper with items and price willing to pay. Works well if you are doing ½ price sale at end of sale. Suggest (with signs) that people can bid (over ½ price) on items they are interested in. They are called before ½ price sale with their items boxed and ready for them with a total.

• Last Hour Free w/donations—donation can be to you or special group

Money & Payment – Decide if you will accept checks or only accept cash. If cash only, this should be stated in ads. You will need a good cash box and plenty of cash in small bills and some coins with backup or someone to get more change if needed. If checks are taken, I would suggest writing down ID info & phone number on checks.

**Check-Out area** – At least 2 or 3 people, one to call off prices and any codes, one to write down and add up sales total and take the payment.

End of Sale – Remember to remove all ads/signs from sale area, cars and internet.

We are here to listen, offer advice and assist you in any way we can to help you through this emotional time. Our suggestions are a guideline for wherever you live or what you must do for "downsizing."

Should you find a need to downsize your household, work with a family estate or for whatever reason this list is meant as a guideline only.
